The **Annamae Rotman Young Organist Competition** was founded in 2013 by Dr. Richard Rotman in honor of his mother and is an annual competition. Eligibility – A competitor must be 24 years of age or under as of August 1 of the competition year and be a resident of Kent County, MI or any county adjacent to Kent County and/or a resident student attending a junior high school, senior high school, college, or university in Kent County or any county adjacent to Kent County (Ottawa, Muskegon, Newaygo, Montcalm, Ionia, Barry, or Allegan Counties)

On Monday evening, March 13th, an appreciative audience attended the 7th Annamae Rotman Young Organist Competition at the Basilica of St. Adalbert. First place with a cash prize of \$1500 was Helen Drost, a student of GRAGO member Jonathan Bading. The second place winner and \$1000 was Andrew Chesebro, whose teacher is member Dr. Joan Ringerwole. The prizes were presented by competition sponsor Dr. Richard Rotman. The judges were Dr. Darlene Kuperus, Jonathan Tuuk and Matthew Jakubisin.

In April 2019, Mr. Laube launched the documentary-style radio program, "All the Stops," on the WFMT Radio Network Chicago, consisting of four two-hour programs which feature many of the world's most famous organs in Europe and the United States and explore their unique histories and repertoire. In October 2020, Mr. Laube joined the organ faculty at the Staatliche Hochschule für Musik und Darstellende Kunst in Stuttgart, Germany, succeeding his mentor, Ludger Lohmann, at his alma mater. There he takes part in one of most dynamic and international centers for organ study, situated in the heart of Europe. Prior to his move to Europe, he served on the organ faculty of the Eastman School of Music from 2013 to 2020.
