He later earned a Master of Music in music history at the University of Kansas, where he also pursued graduate organ study. As an adjunct to his career in software development, he served as a church organist and interim choir director in Virginia for more than 35 years. He also did service on the executive committee of the Northern Virginia chapter of the AGO. After retiring from his day job in 2021, David and his wife moved to Grand Rapids, where he enjoys seeing his grandchildren regularly and getting to know the many fine organs in the city.



Barbara Dulmage (Member at Large) has served churches of various denominations throughout her career, and also taught organ and courses in church music while Artist-in-Residence at Park College in Kansas City, Missouri. Her education includes a MM from the University of Kansas, where her primary instructor was James Moeser.
