January Discussion—Young People and the Organ

On January 27th, 2025 at Trinity Lutheran Church, the GRAGO held a meeting discussing the future of young people and the organ. Rob Hobgood organized the event and several people gave short presentations on their experiences with young people and the organ. Rob Hobgood began with a brief description of a Pedals, Pipes and Pizza (PPP) event he organized in a previous chapter. Bob Houskamp then presented on his program called the Summer Organ Encounter (SOE). This is a program that Bob has completely funded by himself. He is no longer able to maintain the funding and so the future of this program is in question. As one of the main teachers from Holland in Bob's program, Elizabeth West also talked about her experiences with the SOE program. Next, Elizabeth West discussed her experiences leading two Pipe Organ Encounters (POE). Then, Rob Hobgood presented on the Orgelkids kit which allows kids to put together a small pipe organ. The kit can be disassembled and used again at future events. Next, Rob read a submission from Rhonda Edgington who could not be in attendance. She described a family concert she organized centered around animal themes where she played a transcription of Peter and the Wolf and some character pieces by lan Farrington and a few other fun pieces that engaged the kids. Finally we heard from one of Darlene Kuperus' students and her experiences taking organ lessons and playing in church. There was a brief break for some refreshments followed by some discussion about the presentations and experiences of other members attending the meeting.

Some of the take-aways from this meeting.

- 1. The AGO events (PPP's, & POE's) are good but quite involved to organize and pull off well (especially if all the work falls mostly on one person).
- 2. It was stated that Bob Housekamp's SOE program seems to be a good bridge between a PPP (very introductory program for kids who have never played an organ) and a POE (which assumes a certain level of skill at the organ to be involved).
- 3. There was some discussion of possibly forming a sub committee on young people and the organ to help organize/maintain regular events like those discussed above (or others) in the future.
- 4. We heard from Alexis Van Zalen and Darlene's student about the importance of the ability to connect with other organists their age. Darlene mentioned the possibility of helping to organize/support a social get-together of young organists before several chapter events throughout the year. This seems to be the easiest way to get started encouraging young organists to becoming/continue their involvement with the organ.

Caroline Robinson Organ Recital

Organist and church musician **Dr. Caroline Robinson** has been featured as a solo recitalist across the United States, in venues including New York City churches St. Thomas Fifth Avenue, St. John the Divine, Trinity Church Wall Street, and St. Patrick's Cathedral; in Boston: Church of the Advent, Harvard Memorial Church, Cambridge, Methuen Memorial Music Hall;



St. James in the City, Los Angeles; and Kansas City's the Kauffman Center. She has also performed in England, France, and Germany. Her playing has been broadcast multiple times on American Public Media's "Pipedreams," "Pipedreams LIVE!," and Philadelphia-based public radio station 90.1 WRTI's Wanamaker Organ Hour. She has been a featured performer at conventions of the Organ Historical Society, the East Texas Pipe Organ Festival, and the American Guild of Organists, for which she performed on the closing concert at the 2022 National AGO Convention in Seattle, collaborating with Seattle Pro Musica on choral and organ works including James MacMillan's *Cantos Sagrados*.

Dr. Robinson is a laureate of the National Young Artists Competition in Organ Performance (NYACOP), held as part of the 2018 AGO Convention in Kansas City. She holds First Prize from the 11th annual Albert Schweitzer Organ Festival (2008) and from the 10th annual West Chester University Organ Competition (2010). She was a semifinalist in the 2014 Dublin International Organ Competition. In 2016, she was chosen as one of the Diapason's "20 Under 30" promising young organists in the United States. Caroline Robinson is Assistant Professor of Organ at the University of Michigan. Previously she served as Organist and Associate Choirmaster at the Cathedral of St. Philip in Atlanta. There, under the direction of Canon Dale Adelmann, she shared organ playing and accompanying responsibilities and led the cathedral's RSCM-based Chorister program. She is an active continuo player with early music ensembles, having performed at the Rochester Early Music Festival, San Francisco's American Bach Soloists Academy, and now regularly with the Atlanta Baroque Orchestra.

Dr. Robinson completed her undergraduate work at the Curtis Institute of Music, where she studied with Alan Morrison. Aided by a grant from the J. William Fulbright fellowship fund, Caroline studied at the Conservatoire à Rayonnement Régional de Toulouse with Michel Bouvard and Jan Willem Jansen (organ) and Yasuko Bouvard (harpsichord). Caroline holds the Doctor of Musical Arts and the Master of Music in Organ Performance and Literature from the Eastman School of Music, where she studied with David Higgs. Dr. Robinson also received from Eastman the Performer's Certificate and the Advanced Teaching Certificate in Theory Pedagogy.

Dr. Robinson is represented in North America by Karen McFarlane Artists, Inc.




